


WSU Conner Museum Mammal Scavenger Hunt

<p>A mammal that eats fruit: <i>Many correct answers, including: Bush pig, Monkey, Coyote, deer, etc.</i></p>	<p>A mammal that climbs trees: <i>Many correct answers: squirrels (except ground squirrels), sloth, monkey, Slender Loris, etc.</i></p>	<p>A mammal with black and white stripes: <i>Striped Skunk</i></p>	<p>A mammal with a wide, flat tail: <i>Beaver</i></p>	<p>A mammal with horns (not antlers): <i>Bison, Pronghorn, Bighorn Sheep, Mountain Goat.</i></p>
<p>A mammal with antlers (not horns): <i>Mule, Black-tailed, or White-tailed Deer, Elk, Caribou, Moose.</i></p>	<p>A mammals that walks on its knuckles: <i>Giant Anteater.</i></p>	<p>A mammal that hunts deer, elk, and other large herbivores: <i>Best answers: Wolf or Cougar; Acceptable: Coyote, Bear, Wolverine.</i></p>	<p>A mammal whose fur color changes to white in winter: <i>White-tailed Jackrabbit, Snowshoe Hare, weasels.</i></p>	<p>Washington State's Official Endemic Mammal: <i>Olympic Marmot</i></p>
<p>A mammal with webbed feet designed for swimming: <i>Several correct answers: River Otter, Sea Otter, Beaver, Nutria.</i></p>	<p>A mammal with long quills that easily detach: <i>Porcupine.</i></p>	<p>The biggest deer in the museum: <i>Moose</i></p>	<p>A mammal with a pouch: <i>Kangaroo, Opossum, or Koala</i></p>	<p>A hoofed mammal that lives in steep, rocky terrain. <i>Bighorn Sheep, Mountain Goat</i></p>
<p>Two mammals with ringed tails: <i>Raccoon and Ringtail</i></p>	<p>A mammal that people often find "abandoned" but is actually hiding in a safe place: <i>Mule Deer, White-tailed Deer</i></p>	<p>An African mammal with upper and lower tusks: <i>Wart Hog.</i></p>	<p>A mammal that lays eggs. <i>Echidna or Duck-billed Platypus.</i></p>	<p>A sea mammal hunted nearly to extinction before a 1911 treaty protected it: <i>Sea Otter</i></p>
<p>A mammal that cuts down trees: <i>Beaver</i></p>	<p>A Washington mammal that eats mostly insects: <i>Any shrew in Washington.</i></p>	<p>A mammal with big furry feet that hunts snowshoe hares (another mammal with big furry feet) at high elevations in Washington: <i>Lynx</i></p>	<p>The most destructive rabbit species on the San Juan Islands. <i>European Rabbit</i></p>	<p>The carnivore that has dramatically expanded its range from western to eastern North America. <i>Coyote</i></p>
