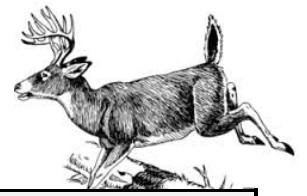


WSU Conner Museum Mammal Scavenger Hunt

A mammal that eats fruit:	A mammal that climbs trees:	A mammal with black and white stripes:	A mammal with a wide, flat tail:	A mammal with horns (not antlers):
A mammal with antlers (not horns):	A mammals that walks on its knuckles:	A mammal that hunts deer, elk, and other large herbivores:	A mammal whose fur color changes to white in winter:	Washington State's Official Endemic Mammal:
A mammal with webbed feet designed for swimming:	A mammal with long quills that easily detach:	The biggest deer in the museum:	A mammal with a pouch:	A hooved mammal that lives in steep, rocky terrain.
Two mammals with ringed tails:	A mammal that people often find "abandoned" but is actually hiding in a safe place:	An African mammal with upper and lower tusks:	A mammal that lays eggs.	A sea mammal hunted nearly to extinction before a 1911 treaty protected it:
A mammal that cuts down trees:	A Washington mammal that eats mostly insects:	A mammal with big furry feet that hunts snowshoe hares (another mammal with big furry feet) at high elevations in Washington:	The most destructive rabbit species on the San Juan Islands.	The carnivore that has dramatically expanded its range from western to eastern North America.
